Poet laureate Carl Sandburg once said, "A tree is best measured when it's down – and so it is with peo-



When KCC started Hawaii Kai Christian Church in 1983, Ron challenged Dawn & me to be part of that church plant. It was there that he not


only asked me to become an Elder (at the ripe age of 29), but gave me my first opportunities to preach.
