Dear Church Family,

More than 1,000 heard the moving eulogy and tributes to Pastor Ron. You were there to pay respects. You also served others and ministered to the Arnold family. Tears of joy came to my eyes when I saw the legacy of people that Ron left -- people like you and me.

I don't know about you, but after the service, I found myself wondering, "What will be my own legacy?" I'm 47 years old and I've made many mistakes. I know my failures and regrets. I have so many.

But God spoke to me on a morning drive this week. He reminded me of some unlikely persons from the Bible who left a legacy. People -- like me -- with failures and regrets, too.

People like Paul the Apostle. He was a career tent maker and his forte was in persecuting Christians "beyond measure." Yes, beyond measure as he says in his own words in Galatians 1:13! But Paul would plant churches all over Europe and Asia Minor. He left a tremendous legacy that we're still talking about today.

Or take Peter, a career fisherman who failed in colossal fashion when he denied Jesus. Yet on the shores of the Sea of Galilee, he's restored over a fish breakfast with Jesus. And Peter moves forward in leaving another kind of legacy for Christ. So what's the secret?

How did they do it? How did Pastor Ron do it?

They were close to Jesus because they were close to the Word.

The secret to leaving a legacy is this: Read the Bible. Meditate on the Word.

Nibbles here. Bites there. Large portions, too. Read it like it's food, because it is. "Man shall not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God." (Matthew 4:4; Deut 8:3)

Here's the thing: When we know God's Word, we know his ways. And when we know his ways, we know his will.

So read the Bible like you're walking with Jesus and having a meal with him. It's the best way to know his heart -- his will for you and others.

And knowing God's will is how He is able to leave a legacy through us. "I and the Father are One," is what Jesus tells us in John 10:30. God blesses us when we're in his will. God can leave a legacy through us that points to Jesus when we are in his will. Let's make it a point to be in the Word so we can know his will better. This will affect every area of our lives, including our decisions and actions.
