Our Plan

Kaimuki Christian Church plans to expand its facilities to house its growing church and school ohana, in order to extend God's love and message of hope to our community, especially to children and youth.

Kaimuki Christian School will enhance the high-quality, Christian, values-based educational experience that it provides.

The Phase II expansion permits classroom space to add grades 11 and 12 by 2016, resulting in a full pre-school to high school Christian education, with much greater value to parents, students and alumni.

The expansion will strengthen the church's outreach to students and their families with the love and message of Jesus, as well as providing much needed space for

ministry activities, Bible study groups, and offices for staff.

The Phase II expansion will construct a new 2.5 story Education Center and a 2-story, 10 classroom education wing to the existing Kaimuki Christian School facility. While more classrooms, storage space and administrative floor-space are important drivers for the expansion, the venture really seeks to have lives changed, future generations reached, and people equipped to serve the Lord.

To insure that its focus is not just on its own requirements, Kaimuki Christian Church is sharing 5% of the collected contributions to building schools in one of the neediest communities of the world – the slums of Nairobi, Kenya. This project will be run by Christian Missionary Fellowship, and will illustrate how faithfulness in Kaimuki can impact lives halfway around the world.

Our Goals

"His Vision – Our Venture" seeks both one-time and periodic investments over a three-year period to achieve a target of \$3 million. These gifts are based on sacrificial giving above donors' existing tithes and offerings.

Construction start is planned for 2015, God willing, if sufficient financial resources are raised, and governmental permitting processes allow.

Construction costs are budgeted to be roughly \$7.85 million.

With the \$1.5 million Clarence T.C. Ching Foundation grant, an anticipated \$3 million in "His Vision – Our Venture" pledges, and cash savings, Kaimuki Christian Church anticipates financing residual cash requirements from our existing relationship with First Hawaiian Bank.

No parking is anticipated to be lost during construction. However, in the long-term, "His Vision – Our Venture" provides the bridge to

Looking Back at God's Grace

1909

Maude Foster starts a Sunday School for neighborhood kids in her home near Koko Head Ave & Harding Avenues.

1920's

Chris Benney our first pastor, arrives and Kaimuki Christian Mission is incorporated. Shortly afterwards, corner property on Koko Head and Harding Avenues was purchased and the first church sanctuary was built.

1960's

Harold Gallagher begins his 32 years as KCC's pastor. Property on Harding Ave next to the church purchased, and Kaimuki Christian School begins. In 1969 a new sanctuary, fellowship hall, classrooms, and offices were built.

1970's

Mahina Street property purchased, and an education wing was extended with addition of 8 classrooms.

1990's


Following Pastor Gallagher's retirement, Ron Arnold begins his ministry as KCC's Sr. Pastor. Friday night services are started and the worship center doubled in size, and 2 more properties purchased & renovated.

2000's

As KCC & KCS grow, 4 additional properties are acquired for new students, staff & the community.

2013

KCC is awarded \$1.5 million Clarence T.C. Ching Foundation grant and the property on 13th Avenue was purchased to start Phase II.

For many years Kaimuki Christian Church has been faithful to our mission to make disciples who love God passionately and their neighbor as themselves. We are now entering into the next phase of our mission as we step out in faith to build facilities on our block. We're calling this phase, "His Vision - Our Venture."

Last year we built the 8-classroom and multi-purpose room facility on the Koko Head side of our Worship Center. Last spring we received a \$1.5 million grant from the Clarence T.C. Ching Foundation. This fall we were able to acquire the essential neighboring property on our block, allowing us to complete our next step of our 2020 Vision. Sometimes referred to as "Phase II" of the Master Plan, this next step will allow us to construct another 10 classrooms and administrative center to take our ministry for Christian education and outreach to the next level.

We felt that in addition to building a home on this block to serve our community and house our growing ohana, we also wanted to extend Jesus' love and acceptance from Kaimuki to the ends of the earth. To that end, we are setting aside 5% of the collected offerings up to \$150,000, for schools in the slums of Nairobi, Kenya.

I hope you will join with Dee and me to prayerfully ask of the Lord how he might utilize us in support of this critical next phase in the mission of Kaimuki Christian Church. We can all ask, "Lord, how would you have us venture out in faith to pursue the vision You've given to our church?" We can then anticipate with excitement how the Lord will powerfully transform lives, from Kaimuki to Kenya!
