## *a WORD from* **PASTOR BRYAN**

Dear Church Family,

I really believe our new series can change our lives! Not that there is some magical formula, but because we will be encouraged to allow God into our lives to bring transformation and change.

The new series is called, “Learning to be Spiritual: 5 Godly Practices that will Change our Lives.” These godly practices are ways we position ourselves to connect with God—prayer, fasting, study, solitude, and worship. Obviously, these are not the only ways to connect with God—but these are five ways. These avenues of connecting with God are also known as “Spiritual Disciplines.” As we practice these disciplines, we give room for God to do the change in us—God does the change—not us. Richard Foster writes in *Celebration of Discipline*, “The disciplines allow us to place ourselves before God so that he can transform us.”

The beauty of the spiritual disciplines is that God meets us wherever we are. Whether we consider ourselves a spiritual beginner or more advanced, all of us have a starting point, and God meets us where we are. So whether you are a believer or not, allow God to meet you where you are. This series will not bring guilt, but encouragement and hopefully empowerment.

However, living in a culture where empirical data is highly valued, can make it difficult to think about the spiritual side of things—the things that cannot be proven with our five senses or repeated in a laboratory. Even with that, there is a longing in us for something more—something deeper!

This series invites us to go deeper—to experience freedom. Experience freedom from trying to fix ourselves—but putting ourselves in a position to have God work within us.

This weekend I am excited to start the series off about talking about the power of prayer—and the reality that prayer really can and does changes things. God hears us, and God acts!
